

Witness says he knew a man named Barber in the 1st Battalion. He was in B Coy, and came with the 4th Reinforcements. Witness knows that he took part in the charge at Lone Pine on 7/8/15.

The casualties in that charge were very heavy and witness has not seen Earber since.
