I knew him as we were in the same meetion, he was over 30 and came from Newtown or Ermore, Sydney. On the 19th April we were at Bares to the 6 or 7 kilometres to the right of Villers Bretonneux and had just some out of the trench in reserve. It was raining and Orowe went to get some straw to make a bed when a bead was dropped by an aeroplane and he was hit in several places. He was taken to the D/Station and bandaged up but we heard a few days later that he died at the C.O.S. I saw him hit but I know nothing about his burial.

Four of them were killed, but I can't recollect the names of others, nor the name of the place. I was there at the time, but did not actually see it. He died, I believe at a dressing station.
