I saw him wounded at Bulawardi Ridge. He was caught by a shell fragment which hit him on the back of the head. He was taken to the dressing station close by. This is the last I saw of him. He was full conscious when taken away. Refer to Bdr. L.R. Brown 110th How. B Battery who is now in France, he is the battery clerk, and can give full details concerning his death andburial.

He was in the telephone pit about 20yds from me at Ypres, about Oct 1st when he was wounded by a shell splinter in the head and died at the C.C.S, about 10 days later. A small dark man medium built. No one else of his name in the battery, in which he was very popular.

# "Died of Wounds 1.10.17."

He was wounded while in a dugout about 100 yards from me at about the end of September on Belleverd ridge, Ypres, by a shell which blew in the dug-out and brought a girder down on him, denting in his steel helmet and I heard that he died at the dressing station the next day. Gnr. Rice of thellOth How Btty, was in the dug-out with him, but was got out uninjured. Dark, med.build, about 25 and the only Dano in the battery.

# "Died of Wounds 1.10.17."

Re Gnr.Dann, A.Mc K. No. 7547 of 110th How Batty A I.F.
Details of this man's burial have already been sent by the Orderly
Room clark and as far as I know he was buried in No. 1 Canadian
Casualty Clearing station, Poperinghe, Helgium. Gnr.Dann was about
5ft 7ins height, with dark hair, and eyes, and would weigh about
11 stone, He was from Footscray, Victoria, and joined this battery
at Serapum, Egypt. As I was sitting alongside him when he was
hit I can give you a little information about the occurrence a
small German shell burst on the Cupola directly above Dann's head,
bending theopieces of iron down and putting a big dent in his
steel helmet. Then I picked him up he had a small surface wound
in the leg and was unconscious. We took him to a local dressing station
where he was found to have a fractured skull. Dann never regained
consciousness and felt no pain. Except for the flesh wounded in
the leg he was unmarked. Undoubtedly his grave would be registered,
as Poperinghe is a big centre and he would have a proper burial there.
