The last time I saw Lieut. D'Arcy was on April 11th at daybreak. He was lying in a shell hole wounded in the right leg just below the knee and was ripping his puttee off so as to use it for a binding. We were then advancing on to Eclle court? and were under heavy machine gun and shell fire. We held the ground for 6½ hours when we had to retire.

Dear Madam,

We have not so far received any communication from 2/1t M.J.D'Arcy of 15th Btn. - but we have always to think of the fact that he is only allowed to write 2 letters or 4 post cards a month, and that his letters to his own people have to come out of those. For some reason or other the Germans may not be letting his letters through. He is not officially reported wounded.

As soon as we do hear from him we will advise you. and hope you will do the same for us should you hear first.
