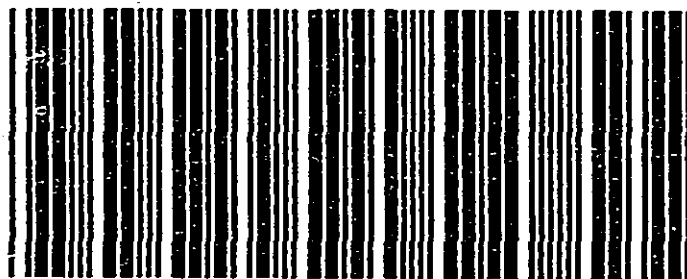

"Died of Wounds 21.10.17."

He died from a shell wound 2 days after he was hit  
(about Oct, 1917) between Lagne House and Bouchesdale Ridge.  
His brother Charles (There is another "C. Anderson" in the  
5th Pioneers and I think is C. Co, but not in the cook house)  
who is a man of about 47 in C. Coy. 5th Pioneers, is the  
Cook house, will have all the details. He came with the 4th  
reinforcement and belonged to C. Coy. A very tall man. We called  
him "Long-legs".
