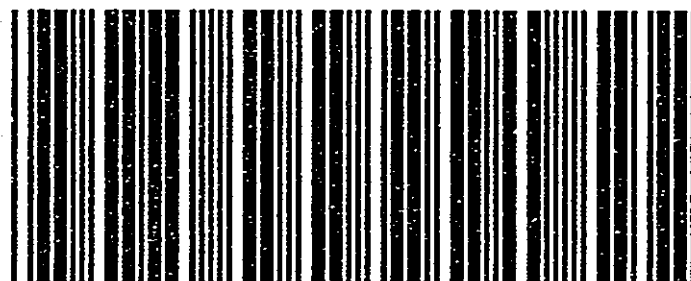

M. 15.4.17.

He was in A Co. I knew Chas. Beattie, and I know his number. I saw his body in a sunken road just outside Hermies. He had been killed by a machine gun bullet. He had been killed outright. There were opportunities for burial, but I know nothing of it.

He was 5'8", dark, 23 years of age, and came from Lidcombe, New South Wales.

Informant said Beattie was in A.Coy. No.2 Platoon and came from Lidcombe. On April 15th, there was a German raid and Beattie was killed by M.G. fire. Informant saw his body on the Sunken Road near to Hermies village. There were 6 or 7 wounds on his body and he had apparently been killed outright.
