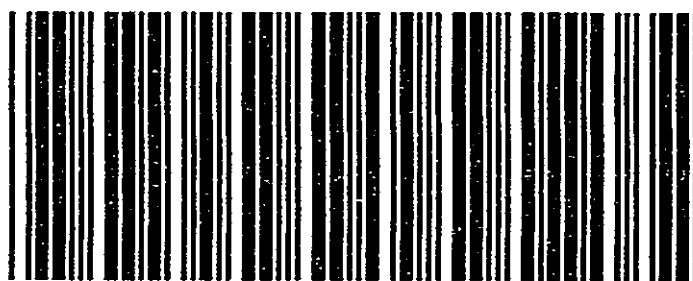

All I can tell you about my mates is that they were buried on the battle field where they had fallen. They were killed by shell fire and they were buried at Morlancourt. That is all I can tell. All property has been sent home to their people. Kindly let me know if this is all you require.

I knew H.G. Andrews well; he was pal of mine in E. Coy. V Plat. and came over with the 17th Reinforcements. I was told by S/Bs Pte. Montgomery and Delo, both of E. Coy. that they had seen him killed at Morlancourt on the 10th June. We were making an attack at the time in the evening and he was killed on our own barbed wire just after going over the top. I tried hard to find him myself afterwards, but could not do so. He was buried by the S/Bs where he fell, 2 days later. From what they told me, I have no doubt that his death was instantaneous. When I left the Battn, Delo was on Paris leave but Montgomery was still with his Unit; this was on Sept. 2nd last.

Andrews was shot through the heart by M.G. bullet just our side of the German wire, just at the left rear of Sully-le-See. We had hopped over and were successful. I saw him hit and was knocked following night myself and can say nothing about his burial.

He was killed by a shrapnel bullet at Villars Bretonneux about June noon on June 10th. He was hit in the head and killed ~~at~~ outright. I. Carter, 27.B. now in Blighty, saw him killed. Andrews was a tall, fair man, single and with a fair moustache; he was known as Bert.
