Eglr. H. Marshall, a returned soldier of the 6th Btn. A. Coy. states that on the 8th May 1915, at Cape Helles, when they got the order to advance, he saw the casualty in the line and is positive that he was not seen afterwards.

Robertshaw, Blakeley, Keeling, Sgt. Basto and 4 others got cut off on April 25, Basto's body being found in front of the firing line on day of armistice. Witness was under the impression nothing was ever seen or heard of Blakeley afterwards, but from the above data, it would appear that he was not missing until several weeks later.
