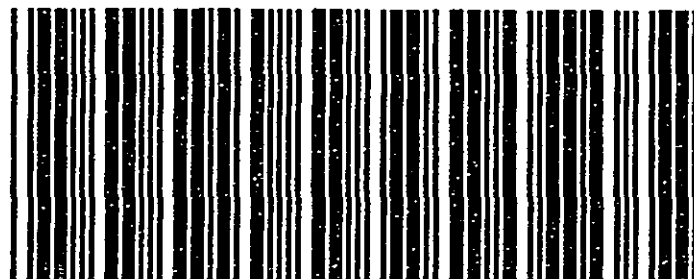

Allan was killed in the same night bombing raid near Villiers Bretonneux as McLennan and others. Didn't see him hit. We took the post the following night. The bodies had been lightly buried by the Germans.

Allan - C.F. short, thickset, fair, about 24/25 years.

I buried the bodies of McLennan, Allan, Joe McIntyre and Byrne the night after they were killed in bombing raid. Allan's initials were G. (George) not C.F.

McKenzie, A Coy., Allan A Coy., and also McIntyre, Lawson and Byrne, were all in a night raid on a post at Villars Bretonneux towards the orchard. We raided the Boche the night before the stunt. After the stunt their bodies were found partially buried by the Boche.
