

"Pte Aoxina was killed by a whizz-bang while on outpost in front of highy on the morning of March =/17. He was buried at the par back of the post where he was killed no cross was erected at the first time. He dame over with the 13th rein, to the 7th patt., joining the decayium, mayet."

He was willed in Thuch as the Servers were retiring man I.g.,
We were at the back of Papause. He was a T/dpl, and at night they sent to me for a L/Cpl to go to an alvanced post so I sent him.up. Hent morning word was brought to me that a shell had burst on the post where he was and had killed him, blowing off his leg. They baried him just behind where he fell. Here is his name and number in my book.

"L/Cpl. Adkins was killed by a "fish-tail" bomb at Ligny Thilloy (?) Harch 4th, holding the trenches. I saw him killed and we buried him just behind the trenches. There was no Padre available and no cross as we were following up the German evacuation."
