I know a soldier who belonged to Co. 4th. 1000000. I do not know his initials or regimental number but think his number would be about 1000000 as he was discharged from the late unit. The same thing I did not know. I believe he came from Victoria. This soldier was wounded on the front somewhere between Longport Farm and Pozieres towards the end of August. He went to hospital I saw him on the 1st of this month going on leave to England. I do not know of any other man of the name of Bellamy in the 4th. 1000000.

" I am afraid I gave wrong information about Lt. Bellamy the other day. I have been worrying about it, and thinking about it all night. I believe I was thinking of another man who was missing one night when we were on the road to Pozieres near the Shalk Pit. I believe that a Lt. Bellamy 4. E. D. is back with the battalion. I think I saw him last at the Front after Christmas. He had returned to Headquarters after having leave for ten days, or was going on leave."

( Researcher's note - please refer to my report on J.E. Bellamy dated 1st Feb. The informant seemed very vexed to think that he may have given wrong information. I called on him as I was going down the ward to tell me. He had a visitor so I could not question him much )

" I knew Bellamy belonging to our platoon. I do not know his initials or number. The man I mean was at the Dardanelles and was wounded at Bezieres on or about the 28th Aug. When I left the Battalion on New Years Day, 1917, this Bellamy was with his platoon. Bellamy was about 5ft 11. slight build, dark just turned 21. He was called " Bell. "

There was a man of the name of Bellamy in the 4th Australian Pioneer Coy. wounded by a shell in a trench during the last week of August. I do not know his regimental number or initials. He was of medium height about 51 or 52 years old, clean-shaven. He was not severely wounded and he went from the battalion for a month or so. I never saw another Bellamy with the battn. But I do not know his initials either.

" I was with Pte Bellamy when he was missing, about 7 p.m. one evening in August. We were on the road to Pozieres, marching up in column route, 4 abreast, till we got near the Chalk pit. The enemy then concentrated fire on us, and we all rushed for cover. We never saw Pte. Bellamy again, and do not know what happened to him. We waited until the fire ceased. Then we got up and went on. He cannot be a prisoner as we were right behind the lines. "
