He was in A Co.; 3rd platoon. He was buried at Needle Trench mear Flers I was there when he was killed. We took them in from the top of the trench and buried them in Needle Trench where we were We put a cross over the grave with the names of those buried in it: there were 5 althogether.

Freddy Branch was killed two days before

Kmss, at Heedle Trench, to the right of Flers.

He had been out with a guard at a dump 30 yards
to the rear of the trench. They came in. Just as
they reached the trench, a H.K.shell hit the parados
and killed him and 4 other: man. I saw Branch's body.

It was riddled with pieces of shell. It was buried
the same morning just to the rear of the spot where
he met his death. I saw the burial. I know him
quite well. He was a very quiet fine living little man.

I saw him killed by a piece of shell the size of your fist, which went right through his neck and killed him almost at once, and saw him dead, at Needle Trench which I also was somewhere about Albert and Gendecourt. and He was buried just out of the trench and I saw his grave with a little wooden cross over it. I knew him well as we came over together from Australia as Reinforcements to the bord. Battalian and were transferred to the 19th. I was in camp with him at Bathaurst. I think he came from somewhere on the North Coast and II think he was a dairyman. Six others were killed and 2 wounded by the same shell.
