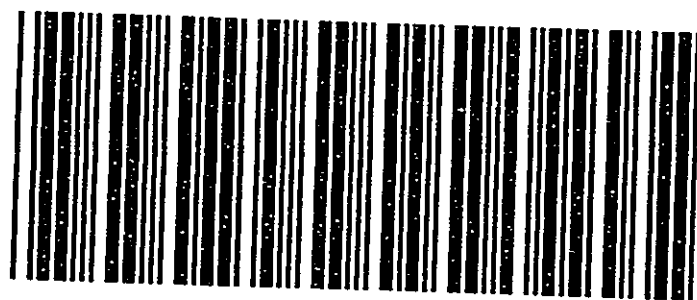

Was shot in the head on night of 7.8.15 and lived about two hours afterwards. Informant gave Bowler's kit to his brother two days ago and has written to his people giving all particulars.

About 9.50 on the night of the 7th August Bowler told informant he was feeling ill - generally run down. About 10 informant and Bowler went to their posts in the trench at Pope's Hill - the two posts being within 20 yards of each other. Within a few minutes Bowler was shot through the head and died a couple of hours later. He was buried in the cemetery at Shrapnel Gully.
