

Fitness says that on 8.8.15 they were charging past the third outpost towards "ay Velley. Blacklock was in this charge, and witness saw him fall on the first ridge. He fell shout 20 yards away from witness. He was dead before daybreak. Witness saw him dead. They had to retire after daybreak. Blacklock was a short, nuggety chap.

Dear Sir.

In reply to your inquiry for 2106 Pte H. J. Blacklock of A Co, 15th Btn, who is officially listed as missing 8/8/15, we have been given evidence to the effect that he took part in a charge on 8/8/15 past the Third Outpost towards Hay Valley and he fell on the first ridge. Our witness saw him lying dead when they had to retire after daybreak. The ground was not retaken in November so there was no chance to recover the bodies. This evidence was confirmed by another man, and yet another witness saw him killed on Hill 971, presumably the same ridge, on Aug 8.

Dear Sir.

We have received your enquiry for information concerning a Private Blacklock in the Australian Imperial Forces through our Searcher, Mr. Addison. As we have reports concerning the view of the forward you the information received.

We fear there is reason to believe that No. 2106, Ptc.H.J. Blacklock was killed on 8th August, 1915, as Ptc. Kemp alid Private Grant, both of 15th Battalion, A Company, saw him fall. Private Kemp says he saw him fall about twenty yards away from him and afterwards saw his body. He describes him as a short nuggety man.

We hear that a man called Blacklock or Blacklocks, described as a large man about 20 stone, was seen on board a hospital ship "Reiva" with a bandaged eye by 616, Private Cathbertson, of 4th A.I.F., who also saw him later at Abbeywood with a glass eye. He was seen at Abbeywood by 682, Private Boltin and 493 Private Haybell, both of 1st A.I.F., who also say he had a glass eye.

No. 715, G.Blacklock is officially reported discharged from Abbeyacod to the Australian Base Depot, Weymouth, so, probably, this is Private Blacklock, who was seen by our witnesses at Abbeywood.
