

Pte. Airey was in my section until we entered Mouquet Farm August 1916. I was then put in charge of a bombing Platoon and he was told off to fill wacancy (as I was one man short) just before we went over the top. The last that I saw of him was climbing over the top with a bag of bombs, as we were going into the papapet attack. He was a big fellow standing about 5'9" to 5'10" and of dark complexion. his hair when long was inclined to be curly and dark colour. He was a great ral of mihe and on coming out of this stunt I made enquiries to see what had become of him, but not a man knew anything about him. This is all the information I can give you about Pte. Airey.
