

I knew all these men quite well. They were all in a dugout just above Bapaume really two miles in front at a spot where the Germans began to evacuate. A mate of mine named Pte George Thompson was with them. He left them at 12 o'clock midday. When he left he discovered that the dugout was very nearly surrounded by Germans, but he just managed to escape. Our own men then saw the Germans close in and take all these men prisoners.
