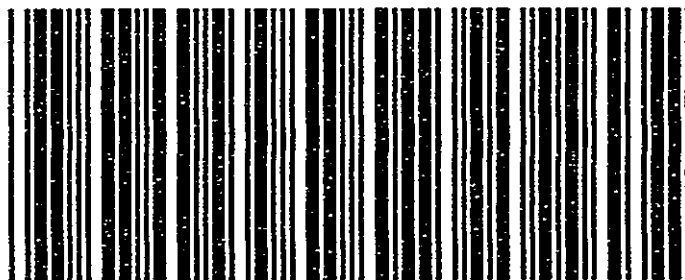

NOTE.

In all cases state fully if informant says he saw or heard and give DATE AND PLACE of occurrence.

Before examining O.List "Davey" came to the Searcher and said:-

"Can you give me any information about a Ball named George Campbell (Binks)

(sometimes called "Ginger")? He belonged to my original Coy 28<sup>th</sup> Batt: before I was transferred to the 2nd Divon Salvage Coy. My brother Fred Davey married his Sister, and Campbell and myself joined up together.

Campbell was reported missing at Fliers in Nov/16. He was a stretcher bearer at the time. I cannot give his No. It was a fairly high one. " ? (5xxx)

Upon turning to the O.L. He said:- this must be the man referring to "G. Campbell No 2355" but I thought it was a higher No! Shall be glad for the sake of his relatives to get any further particulars. in Hospital If he was a prisoner or in Hospital, my brother Fred or myself would certainly have heard from him before now. I give my brother's address above

PLEASE ALSO ANSWER THE FOLLOWING:-

1. Was Informant Eye-Witness?
2. If not, give name, number, etc., of the man who told him.
3. Was the ground held or lost?
4. If Informant says a man was killed, was death instantaneous, and was the body buried, and if so where?
5. Did Informant know Christian Name, Initials or No. of man enquired about?
6. Was there any other man of same name in Co. or Battalion?
7. Give Informant's description of man enquired about—any nickname, marks, scars, etc.

8. Searcher's opinion of Informant's accuracy and intelligence
