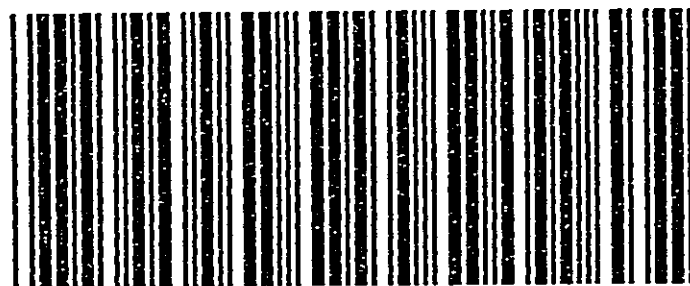

Re Pte. Grant. He was admitted and died 5-7-18 from multiple shell wounds. He was buried at Crouy - Plot 3 - Row D - Grave 8. I wrote his wife at time of death.

I know Private Robert J. Grant, D. Company. He had the H.M. and was enlisted in Tasmania; between 20 and 30, fairly tall and well built, fair, clean shaven. I saw him being carried out on July 4th. 1918 in the Hamel stunt, and saw his grave after in the Crony Military Cemetery. I made the cross for his grave and placed it on the grave.

"Died of Wounds 5/7/18."

Cf D. Company, 14th Platoon. At Hamel on the 4th July just at start of our attack, was hit by piece of phosphorus shell which exploded his cartridge belt - was hit all over. Was taken to R.A.P. and then to Casualty Clearing Station at Crony where he died. I was 4 or five yards away when he was wounded. Was buried in Military Cemetery at Crony, cross erected. I have seen his grave, which is well looked after. Christian name Bob. Came from Tasmania - was a fine soldier.
