"At Noreuil on the Bapaums Front, on May 15th, the Germans put up a 16 hour barrage, and Gulley was killed by shell fire. He died very soon after he was hit and was buried about 2 miles to the right of Moreuil near the Sunken Road. Pte.E.H. Doyle, B Co. Batman to an officer; but since killed, told me this in July in billets, near a place called Herrissart, about 14 kils. from Albert. Doyle was a great chum of Gulley and as I knew Gulley well I asked for news of him. He belonged to B Co."
