Informant states that: On Sept. 5th 1916, at Houquet Farm, we made an attack at 6 a.m. it was successful, but we had a hard time. The Germans combarded as heavily, any of our wounded left out must have been killed, it was too hot for the stretcher bearers to go out to the wounded, but as soonnas possible they made a complete search of the ground, but found all killed. In many places the bombardment had been so heavy they were blown to pieces and buried in. It was not possible for Goodwill to have been taken prisoner.

We are in receipt of your letter of inquiry for No.1657 Pte Walter Goodwill, 49th Fatt. A.I.F. and regret to state that we have only sad news to give you. Pte Goodwill is officially reported "Missing 3-9-16" and we have to hand several unofficial reported from his conrades. Evidence of this kind we can saly quote, but we cannot in any way vouch for its accuracy.

Ho. 1682 Ptc A Kelly, A.Coy. 49th Ba t. gave evidence that a man belonging to the battalion had picked up a parbook at Houquet Farm on Sept. 3rd out in No Man's Land. There was a dead bedy alongside the parbook which they believed to be Goodwill's He adds that Goodwill belonged to A.Coy and that he knew him quite well.

Lieut. W.H. Divine, 49th Batt. A.I.F., who was at 1 Moreton Gardens Hospital, S.W. on Hov. 21st 1916 reported Fon Sept.5th 1916 at Mouquet Farm we made an attack at 6 a.m. It was successful but we had a hard time. The Germans bombarded us heavily, and any of our wounded left out must have been killed. It was too hot for any of our stratcher-bearers to go out, but as soon as possible they made a complete search of the ground but found all killed. In many places the bombardment had been so heavy they were blown to pieces and buried in. It was not possible for Goodwill to have been taken prisoner.

In 1694 Bte F Marchant, 49th Batt, Ward 7 Bath War Hospital, on 7.12.16 stated: "Goodwill was a reserve machine gunner. About Sept.2nd at Mouquet Farm he was hit by an explosive shell and killed on the spot. I was near him when this happened, but did not actially see him killed. I knew him well as we had come over together."

We are very sorry to have to forward such distressing news but only trust that it may be some comfort to his people to know that he was evidently killed instantly. Should any further news come to hand we shall immediately advise you.

Informent, Cpl. A.B. Forbes writing from France says that Pte . Goodwill was killed instanteneously by a high explosive shell while carrying rations on fatigue duty at Honquet Farm.

He describes the soldier as 5 ft. 4 in. in height, of stout build end dark complexion and about 35 years of age.

We very much regret to advise you of the receipt of further unofficial evidence about your brother-in-law Ho. 1657 Pto W. Goodwill, 49th Battn., A.I.F., informant being Ho. 1750 Pto Petrick Stack of the same Unit, who was in the 1st London General Hospital, Combervell.

He says that he saw his body at Honguet Farm on Sept.

4th. the day after the attack had been made, and he believes that death must have been swift and painless. They had come ever on the same boat from Australia, and he describes him as middle-aged, 5 ft.

7 ins. in height, dark and clean shaven, and says he was nicknamed "Watty".

Ho. 1625 Pte W. Ball of the seme Unit who on Lay 25th, was in No. 1 Command Depot, Perham Downs, says that he saw Pte Goodwill killed instantly by shell explosion while going over in the attack on Manuet Farm on Sept 5rd, 1916. He came from Queensland with the 2nd reinforcements of the 49th Battn., on the troopship "Hawkes Bay", and had previously been a carpenter in some South Pacific Island, informant describing him as dark and short, of medium build and 30-55 years of ago.

We deeply regret the distressing chreater of these reports, and have now closed our enquiries believing that further search would reveal no fresh particulars.
