Re the death and burial of 4112 Pta.P.Cooney. 26th Batta. I have to inform you that he was admitted to this Ambulance on 11-3-8 suffering from G.S.W. of head, and died on this account the same day. He was buried in the Military Cemetery on the outskirts of the village of Lamotte-an-Santerre, which village is situated on the main read from Villers-Bretenneux to Peronne.
