"I last saw the two cousins Richard Thomas Carroll (52, A.I) and Thomas Richard Carroll (52, A.I) when we were going up to the tranches on the night of Aug. Ond ready for the attack. We want over on the monring of Sept. 3rd at Honquet Farm. We were fairly successful. We took part of our objective and held it until the night of 4th Sept. It is understood among ourselves that both the cousins were killed. We all believe this. Some of the other men said they saw them killed, but I cannot remember their names."

Theybrere cousins and belonged to I plat. A.Cov. R.T. Carroll was sniped while in a shell hole on September 4th at Mouquet Farm with L/Cpl. E.C. Green, I pl.A.Cov. 52 battn. Green told about having seen the casualty himself. He could supply details. T.R. Carroll was struck in the body and the hip by pieces of shell while in our front line at Mouquet Farm on September 4th. He died almost immediately. Green could give details about this. Pts. R.V.C. Holden. I pl.A.Cov. could also supply information as to T.R. Carroll's case. They both came from the N.W. coast of Tasmania.

Carrell I have already sent you particulard of his death, but no doubt it has gone astray. I was with Pte Carrell on Sept. 3rd and he was shot in the head by a sniper, and when I left him he was in my opinion dead, having part of his head blown off. But having to move at the time I had not chance to examine him properly. But I have little doubt he was fead. Pte. R. T. Carrell was about 5 feet 9 or 10., in height, fresh complexioned with rather fair hair, a well made chap. This is about all I can say, but if I can give you any more particulars I shall be obliged.
