"Your letter of the 20.9.17 received, Re. 5692 Pte. F. Harrison A.I.F. The man was admitted to the Reserve Lazarette on 18.7.17 suffering from ~~an~~ appendicitis in a most severe form. After 14 days patient got worse, and though best medical attention was given, died at 7.a.m. on 21.8.17. and was interned a few days later in Lager Cemetery by an English Clergyman.. The patient was under the care of English Orderlies".

In answer to your enquiry about

No 5692 Pte. ^FE. HARRISON, 15th Battalion, A.I.F.

who died as a prisoner of war in Germany.

We regret that the following sad details have been
received from Pte. H.A. Deakin, in the 15th Field Ambulance,
who was in the same camp where he died. "5692 Pte. F. Harrison

was admitted to the Reserve Lazarett on 18.7.17, suffering from
appendicitis in a most severe form. After 14 days, patient got
worse and though best medical attention was given died at 7 a.m.
on 31.8.17, and was buried a few days later in Lager Cemetery by
an English Clergyman. The patient was under the care of English
Orderlies".

We enclose a postcard of the cemetery sent by Pte. Deakin and
trust that it will be some comfort to you in your loss which is
attended by such painful circumstances.
