Informant stated that these two Soldiers were brothers and he believes that one of them came from Bathurst.

Informant states that they all belonged to the 17th Company, 4th Battalion, Imperial Camel Corps. On 30.3.18 the Battalion was in action at Amman, Palestine. The Turks however, forced them back and at about dusk in the evening Informant was told that both brothers were killed by the ene shell when working their machine gun. He did not see this happen although he was only about 150 yards away, but saw both brothers sometime after they were killed. He also saw them buried near Amman. A Padre read the Service and a cross was put on the grave with their names etc., there one.

The under-noted confirmed the date and place of death, but stated that he was told by one of his mates who was on the same gun with the two Campbells that he saw them both killed by machine gun fire, one being killed hour before the other. It will be noted, however, that Phillips only saw the brothers after they were killed.

M.H.Campbell was No 2 on Machine Gun - he was killed 10 minutes after by bullet - at the same place and position as his brother. M.H.Campbell had taken his brothers position as No 1 as soon as his brother was killed. Each of them was killed instantly - Both wase hit in head.

They would be buried in the Cametery at Jaffa. I saw the bodies after they were killed. Did not see the graves on burial. Both men were much liked by the unit and were good steady fellows.
