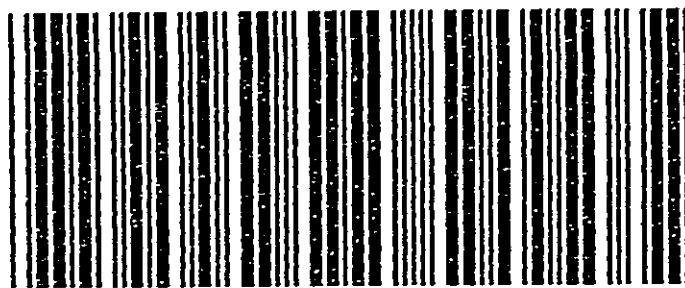

the death and burial of -

12307 Pte. M.A. GRAHAM. 10th Field Ambulance. A.I.F.

We beg to inform you that he died as a result of pleurisy and complications at No 1 Australian Auxiliary Hospital, Harefield on 9-3-17, and was buried in the Australian Military Burial ground in Harefield Parish Churchyard (grave No 15) on 12-3-17, by Chaplain Gregg MacGregor. If you wish for a photograph of the grave we advise you to apply to the Graves Department. A.I.F. Headquarters. Horseferry Road, S.W. 1.
