Pte D. Taylor of 5th Battn. has handed me your letter of enquiry re 1/Gpl. Haynes. Pte. Taylor knew him well and identifies him as a man of dark complexion, stout and thick set. He was wounded in the afternoon of an attack on Bullecourt. He came back to Headquerters and was killed very soon after coming in. The Sgt. of his platoon informs me that a shell caught three of them standing together, an officer and two men. L/Cpl. Haynes! body was laid aside together with the body of the other man killed to be buried at the first opportunity. Some time soon afterwards Beveral shells were placed in the spot where these bodies were laid, the result being that they were blown buent hurial. The officer, Capt. Griffiths! body had been laid in a different spot and a party were more fortunate in securing his body for burial the next day.

Haynes was killed by a shell while in the font line at Bullecourt, on May 9th., 17. He lingered for half an hour, but was unconscious the whole time. Our battalion left the line the next day, and I cannot say if he was buried. I knew him well, and we were in England together. Came over on the S.S. Orvieto, on 21/10/14.
