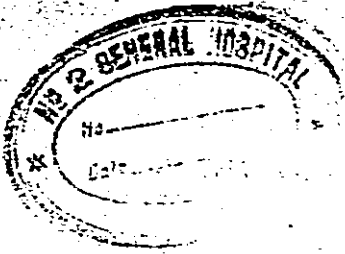

Dear Madam,

We regret to inform you that we have now received a report from the O.C. of the No 2 General Hospital, B.E.F. respecting -

1623 Pte. LESLIE A CAMERON, 36th Battalion, A.I.F.

for whom you are enquiring. He stated that Pte. Cameron was admitted to the Hospital on April 6th, suffering from gunshot wound in the left thigh, with compound fracture of femur. He died at 8-30 a.m. on April 24th as the result of this wound and septic thrombosis of the sciatic veins and was buried in the Cimetiere Ste Marie at Havre April 26th, 1918.

We have now closed our enquiry as we do not think it likely that any more definite information will be received but should any be forthcoming we will at once advise you.
