

Informant states: "Pte W.Reid of our Co., told me last month what Gorrie was killed at Gaba Tepe, about 27th or 28th April.

Reid is now at Abbeywood, I don't know his exact number but it is

somewhere in the 200to300. Pte Regan, also at Abbeywood, could confirm."

Gorrie was in R.Coy. No. 5. Platoon and on the Saturday of the lazding was down at the Cook House where he was killed by a shell. Witness having been wounded, was away from the Peninsula at the time, but on his return in May inquirted about Corrie who was a friend, and was given these details by Anderson and Regam of the 6th A.I.F. B.Coy. 5. Hatoon, who were in the Cocky House at the time, Anderson being wounded by the same shell. Gorrie was killed instantaneously.
