Reid is now at Abbeywood, I don't know his exact number but it is somewhere in the 200 to 300.

Pte Regan, also at Abbeywood, could confirm."

Gorrie was in B. Coy. No. 5. Platoon and on the Saturday of the landing was down at the Cook House where he was killed by a shell. Witness having been wounded, was away from the Peninsula at the time, but on his return in May inquired about Gorrie who was a friend, and was given these details by Anderson and Regan of the 6th A.I.F. B. Coy. 5. Platoon, who were in the Cook House at the time, Anderson being wounded by the same shell. Gorrie was killed instantaneously.
