

He was killed at Flors on 25th.Cot. I was about 20 yards away from him at the time in the same recerve trench. A shell came over and killed him outright. I heard all about the casualty immediately though I did not see the body. I know that his body was buried just behind the trench from what the men told me but I have not seen the grave. He belonged to D.Co. I knew him well as Dug Grant.

"Killed 25,10,16"

I saw him killed by shell. His head was badly shattered. I helped to bury him along with Cpl J.S.Davies and Pte John Wildie (D) in one grave near the top end of Fish Alley (Flers supports) I made the cross myself with their names on it. Grant was a fine young fellow. His name was Douglas and his people live in England.

"I knew Grant and his number. His Christian name was Douglas. He was killed at Flers trench in front of Bapaume on Oct. 25th/16 at sbout 7 o'clock in the morning. I saw him just after he had been hit by a shell and he had been killed instantly. He was buried the same day about 100 yards behind the Flors trench and about 8 others were also buried there. I have seen his grave with his name and number. He came from Victoria and from what he told me he had been there only three years and had come from England. He was of my platoon."
