#### "Missing 5-3-18"

We saw him out in "No Man's Land" at the Warneton Sector, near Armentieres, whilst we were cut on a raid. He was wounded very badly about the head, and was unconscious. It was then about midnight. I knelt down beside him and spoke to him, but got no response. He was breathing very faintly, and was ex piring quickly. As nothing could be done for him, we continued on our raid, and left him there. I knew him fairly well, and always called him "Reg". I do not know if he was afterwards brought in and buried, and I cannot refer to anyone for further details.

#### "Missing 5-3-18"

Re 2330 Pte.R. Hagan, late 36th Battn. All I can tell you is that he was posted as Missing after a raid on the German front lines, and from accounts from the boys that were alongside him during the raid, I have good reason to think that he was shot in the forehead. A pal who was with him, a S/B, tells me there was no doubt about him being killed. I wrote to his Mother, and also his brotherin-law, who is in the 11th F.C. Engrs. A. I.F., and his brotherin-law called round to see me, when I told him all particulars, am he said he would write home and tell them the sad news. Of course there may be just a possible chance that the poor lad was taken prisoner, but our Battn. have never been advised of such a happening. As regards his personal appearance, he was only very young, I think about 19 or 20, medium build, and dark complexion, had a very pleasant appearance, but I don't know that I could give you any other information.

#### Missing 5.3.18.

During a raid on the German trenches at Wamaton, on the 5th of March, I saw Reg Hagan lying in No Man's Land outside the German wire. I asked him what he was doing and as I received no answer. I shook him by the arm. He made no response, so I turned him over on his back and discovered that bullet had penetrated his forehead. Death must have been instantaneous.

as there were many wounded lying about we were obliged to leave the dead behind. Then a body of man were sent out later to

recover the dead, Hagan had disappeared,
