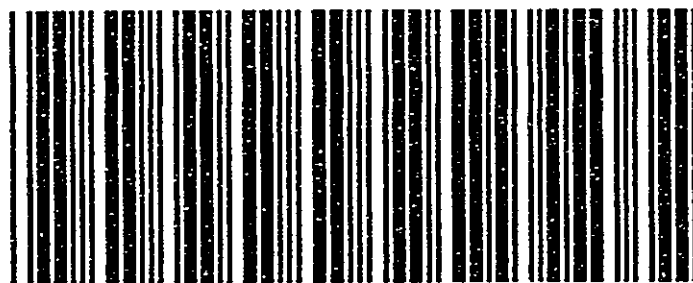

Carter was in the same company as me. I saw him hit by machine gun fire about 3 p.m. on 25th Sept. 1917 at Ypres. He was hit in the head and death was instantaneous. No idea as to where he buried. Carter was a Broken Hill lad, very young, slight build and dark. Very jolly chap and popular among the boys.

I saw him killed by a shell, the same shell wounded me, this happened as we were consolidating at Polygon Wood. I could not say if he was buried. I knew him in the Coy, He came over with the 14th reinf of the 27th batt, and transferred to the 51st. He came from West Australia.
