In C. I. Just near Morlancourt on the 11th August about midday C. Coy. (mine) were facing outpost. We were in a salient. I could see from the outpost I was in Hegarty wounded in the back with another fellow by the name of Cox. They evidently intended to make for our lines but went straight towards a mound behind which were the enemy, fellows from 11 & 18 outposts called to them but they were going towards Fritz, so they couldn't have heard them.

the day he was missing. Through
the A. C. C. I heard of a person
of his description, wearing the
2nd Pioneer Battalion emblem. I
seen near the Breunung Station, in
the circumstances the authorities
soon after that I heard that he was
buried close by where the body
was seen. I had no chance to
go and see the grave myself.
Hoping you will be able to
trace him and let me know.

soon.
