In response to your request for further particulars of Sgt. Conner, 105 British Machine Gun Coy, see our enquiry of - 23-8-16. We are informed by cable from Sydney that they have no further information than that contained in the following slip, which we sent you on 19-10-16, but perhaps you did not receive it. It points to further information being obtainable from Mr. Thornhill a Solicitor in Cork - though the address is rather vague.

Sergeant Francis McCarty Conner, 105th Machine Gun Brigade Headquarters, British Expeditionary Force. Reported Wounded and Missing on the 30th May, 1916. A letter has been received from Mr. Walter Thornhill, a Solicitor in Cork, Ireland, to the effect that he had received a letter dated 8th June from Sergeant Conner, stating that he was Wounded and taken Prisoner on the 30th May, 1916, and was at that time
