I knew him well; he commanded No. 3. Section and was a fine soldier and well liked. I did not see him killed nor did I see his body but I was told that he was hit in the stomach by bullet on Villers Bretonneux Sector at end of April 1918, and died of wounds at the D/Station behind our lines, and that he is buried at Vignicourt in a Military Cemetery and there is a cross on his grave.

Lieut. CLASPER was admitted to this C.C.S. 30-4-18, suffering from a penetrating wound of the abdomen.

His condition was on admission was most grave and he died on the same day at 5 p.m. He passed away quite peacefully, and unconscious of his condition. He left no message.

The burial took place on 1-5-18 in the local Military Cemetery.

Bally. I was driving at the time; It was about 4 p.m. when I
saw him wounded by a H.Q. Bullet. I think it was in the head.
I saw him put on the stretcher and heard afterwards that he died
of wounds later on that day and was buried at a little village, I
can't know the name. He had been acting Transport officer.

"Died of Wounds 30-4-18"

Re the late Lieut. W.J. Clasper, M.C. of the above Unit. He was very seriously wounded on the 30th April 1918 in early hours of the morning at Villers Bretonneux (Bullet wound in Abdomen). He was conveyed away very quickly to the R.A.P. and from there sent on by a special ambulance to the 61st C.C.S. Lt. Clasper was immediately operated on, but although he put up a great fight for his life he succumbed to his wounds on the evening of the 30 April 1918. He was buried at Vignacourt Military Cemetery France, the day after. Lieut. Clasper was a great favourite in this Company, very well liked by all the boys and as an officer I cannot say too much for him. He was a great soldier and a thorough gentleman. It was a very sad blow indeed to the Company when he met his death. He was recommended for his gallantry and coolness in a previous engagement at Hebuterne, France, and just after his death it was gazetted that he had received the Military Cross. A cross was erected by the members of this Company over Lieut. Clasper's grave. Photographs of his grave could be had by applying to the:-

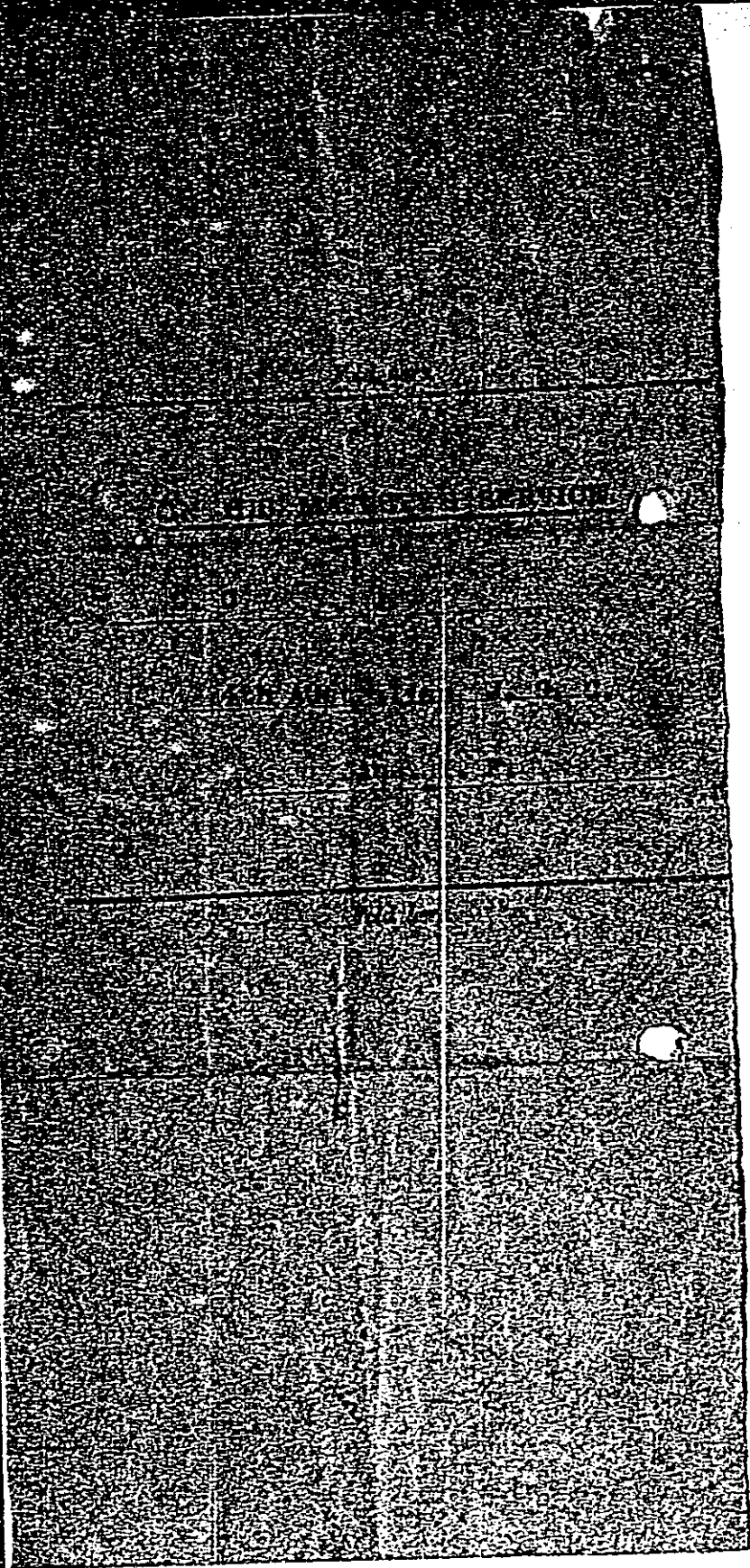

In reply to your letter enquiring ^{5th} 2nd about the late Lieut W. J. Clasper M.C. of this Unit, I shall be only too pleased to give you a few details concerning his death.

He was very seriously wounded on the 30th April 18th in early hours of the morning at VILLERS BRETTONEUX (Bullet wound in abdomen)

He was conveyed away very quickly to the R.A.P. and from there sent on by a special ambulance to the 11th Casualty Clearing Station.

Lt Clasper was immediately operated on, but altho' he put up a great fight for his life he succumbed to his wounds on the ^{evening} of 30th April 1918.

He was buried at VIGNACOURT Military Cemetery France, the day after.

Lt Clasper was a great favourite in this Company, very well liked by all the Boys, and as an officer I cannot
