J. Thornhill Crane, 3rd Battalion, who is reported as "Missing 7-12/8/15" at A.I.F.Headquarters, and the very few details we can supply.

From several unofficial reports we are led to believe that Corporal Crane was very severely wounded in the head on 7th August just after the Lone Pine charge, when the Eattalion was stationed in the third trench in the firing line, and that he died very soon aftermess. At this terrible time of stress it was almost impossible for the men to take notice of what was happening to their comrades, but Private C. Lambkin, 2165, now returned to Sydney, stated that Corporal Grane was only three men away from his at the time, and he saw the body of Corporal Grane being carried away by his comrades.

Trusting that the knowledge that Corooral Crane died gallantly in the famous Lone Pine charge will be of a little comfort to his friends Yours truly,

We have then asked by Miss Jossie Perrin of Balham to add to our list the name of Pte. J.H. Grane 2121 3rd Battalion, A.I.F and to send information to you. The name has been on our list for some time and all possible enquiries have been made. Below you will find some unofficial report from our searchers -

Pte. Martin Gallagher, D. Company, 3rd Battalion, saw this happen. Gallagher told witness he was sure Grane was too much demaged to live. Witness knew Crane well and described him as a dark think set fellow who came from Surrey Hills, N.S.W."
