(K. October 12/18)

"At Passaendaele 12th October. Se were advancing on the ridge and had got to within about 500 yards or our objective when a shell landed within about 20 yards of Dodd Killing him outright. I was from 15 to 20 yards from him at the time. I did not see his grave, but it is certain to have been within 100 yards of where he fell in a plot maked out for graves."

The only Dodd I knew in the Bn. was a Sgt. in B.Co. He was an original Bn. man. I believe his people live in Brishane. He was quite a young fellow - tall and fair, and a very finelooking chap. We called him "Doddy". I knew him in training at Bell's Paddock, Enoggia. He was killed on or about 12th.Oct. in the support lines up nest Passchendaels. We were in supports during the attack. He was hit in the early morning by a shell and killed outright absolutely. shell hit him in the chest. I saw his body shortly efterwards Our Bn. came out of supports there very lying in the trench. shortly after this and I have never heard anything of his burial but no doubt he would be buried.
