Witness was in 13 A.I.F. and his number 978 and thinks this man was in the 13th as there was an Arthur Challenger, whose number would be about 890. Witness saw Arthur Challenger on April 25 after the landing at Anzac on the left of their position - almost the extreme left - half a mile inland, but missed him after that and never heard of him since although he was on the peninsula five months afterwards.
