

#### D/W. Nov.5/17. Det.D/B.

I saw Pte Clissold(17. D. XIV?) hit by a shell, about 2nd or 3rd.Nov., on the right of Anzac Redoubt, while we were on fatigue, in advanced reserves. We had to continue on with our work & he was taken away by the S/Bs. It was dark, & the shelling was pretty heavy. I never heard anything more of him we thought he would get home. I am sorry that I cannot give the names of the S/Bs.

Eyewitness: - Yes.

Description: He was young. I can give no particulars, as he on ly joined a few days before.

#### Died of Younds 5/11/17.

Informant described Cliscold as about 5 feet 6 inches high, mediem build, fair complexion, aged about 21 or 22. Was a Commercial Traveller in civil life.

Informant states that they both belonged to D. Company.
Chiscold being attached for the time being to informant's platoon.
On a date before 5/11/17 the Bettalion was at Connebeke. Clissold and Informant were measure of a night fatigue party and while they was at work. Clissold was badly hit by shraped. Informant was about 3 or 4 yards away and saw his immediately after he was hit.
He was conscious and spoke to his mater. Informant helped to carried the Dressing Station at Curlin Point about 3 or 4 hundred yards from where he was hit. Informant waited there to see how has get on and after his wounds were dressed, another relay took him to the Field Ambulance. Informant saw him set out and wished him good luck and in reply, Clissold told him that he would write to him and let him know how he got on. No letters came over and until I told him, Informant did not know that Clissold was dead.
