

Chalson came down on same ambulance as I did from Westhock Ridge to C.C.S. Renin Road, that is where I last saw him. I've seen in Anxso Balletin that he had died of wounds - We were hit by the same shell - I gave his particulars at Dressing Station as he could not speak.

#### Chalson, Spr. A. 2502, 1st Tunnelling Coy

(#. Uncif H. Sept. 29/17)

"Chalson died at the dressing station on 29th Sept. 1917. We were at Ypres at the time and I was wounded by the same shell. Chalson was a stretcher bearer and he was badly wounded in the leg, chest and other places. He made a terrible row after he was hit and I followed him to the same dressing station and was told that Thelson had died of his wounds. It happened about 6 a.m."

\*Chalson was badly wounded, but quite conscious. He was struck by a shell behind our lines and carried to a dressing station close to Ypres or Henin Road by (I believe) Cpl Ted Harlett and others. He died at the dressing station and it was the General remark that he was game to the end. A man named W. Lawson of the same company was wounded by the same thall and this man can give full information.

The men who carried him out told me that Chalson had both his legs shot off and died whilst being carried to D.S. They were 1st Tunn. Coy. men but I can't remember their names. He would probably be buried in Menin Road. The Orderly Room Sgt.could give full information as to this.

I knew Gus Chalson of the 1st Tunn.Co. He was a S/D.

dark, heavy moustsche, age 35-40.

I saw him wounded in the arm and leg by H.E. at Westhock Ridge while making dugonts. I don't remember the data but it was when we were making the Elephant dugonts. I saw him taken off to the D/Station. Sappor Otto Winter of the let Tunn.Co. (now with the Company) was one of the S/Bs and said he arrived all right at the D/Station. It was on a little ridge half a mile from Westhook kidge. I heard in the Company afterwerds that he died.
