"In reply to your letter asking for some information about the late Pte Cone who died in this Hospital. He came here suffering from severe wounds. He had had one leg amputated, and also had a gunshet wound which had penetrated right through the bladder. His general condition was very septic and his case a very serious one. His death was very pesceful and he was conscious until about an hour before he died. He was buried in the Military Cemetery here at Hetley which is not very far from this Hospital and the "Last Post" was sounded over him. Two of our Sisters who are from New Zealand went to the funeral and a detachment of R.A.M.C. There was a wreath sent by the New Zealand Red Cross. I am afraid Ichave mo photo of the Cemetery which I can send for theorelations, but enclose one of the church which they might like to have. I think I have told you all I can now"
