Clarke, Sig. C.Coy. was killed outright at Polygon Wood, by a shell. I was told by my chum, A.Lillindele 2933, but did not say anything as to his burial. Lillindele was killed, accidently shot, at Wytschaete in Feb.last. I heard he, Lillindele, died form wounds in arm and chest at a C.C.S., and that he was buried but I do not know which C.C.S. or where he was buried.

### CLARKE G. W. Prive

#### KILLED, 26/9/17.

Informant described Clarke as about 5 ft. 6 inches high, medium build, aged about 20/25. Christian name "George."

Informent states that on 26/9/17, the Battalion was at Polygon Wood Ypres, holding the line. About 6-30 y.m. while Clarke was carrying arminition, a shell came over and killed him outright, five or six others being hit by the same shell. Informant was only about 10 or 12 yards away and saw him fall. The body was taken away and buried quite close to where he fell. Informant had been speaking to Clarke earlier in the day.
