I saw Colly C.Coy., killed at Hent Allaines about 7-30 a.m.  
near me about 20 yards in front of where Archer was wounded. He  
also was hit in the pit of the stomach by machine gun bullet, he  
was conscious for a few minutes but died where he fell. He would be  
buried near where he fell.

Killed in Action. 2-9-18

We were attacking an enemy machine gun strong point at Mont St. Quentin, on the morning of 2-9-18, when I saw him shot through the abdomen by a machine gun bullet. He only lived half an hour, and was unconscious. He was buried at Mont St. Quentin, in a military cemetery. A cross suitably inscribed was erected by our Battn. Was an eye-witness of his death, but not burial. He was a dark pleasant looking boy, of about 20 years, medium size.
