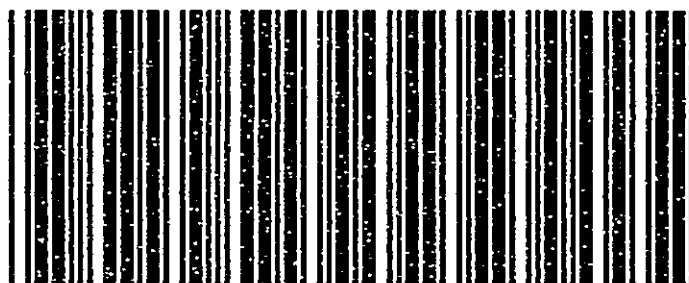

"Missing 11.4.17"

No. 5997 Pte. S.G.K. Cormack 13th Battn. 19th Rfts, officially reported "missing" on the 11th April 1917 and mentioned in our cable of the 12th May, and our letter of the 15th May. Cpl. G. Millar of the 26th Battalion has written a letter dated 30th May, stating he found a diary on a German who had been killed, with the name of S.G.K. Cormack on the cover, and containing a list of addresses of people in Australia.

I knew them. Both numbers are about that. Marchant was rather short, medium build, dark, and about 30-5. Bonner was short, sturdy, dark and about 25 and his name was p Percy. Both were killed outright on that day while we were waiting in shell holes for the "hop over" at Anzac Ridge, Ypres. The Germans were coming over themselves and put a barrage on us. I saw them both buried just there on the 6th.
