

Re your enquiries for 234 Pte.A. Cassell. Left Australia 1914. with the artillery, transferring into the 3rd Fld Coy Engineers in Egypt as a driver, and later on when this division was formed in Egypt, he transferred into the lothFls Coy Engineers and was made a L/Corporal in the transport, he was 26 years of age, height about ofteins weight about 12stone, dark curly hair, very high forehead. He was out in charge of a ration limber on a very masty part of the front and both he & his pony were killed by the same shell. The driver arrived home & reported him killed & a couple of boys went went out & brought him in & was buried in the Dickebusche Huts Cemetery, Head a service & the Bugler sounded the last post, A.C. of E read the burial service. The Cemetery is regt. also his grave but we hevenot it at the present time,

"Killed in Action 21.10.17."

Re particulars of 234 Pte.A.Cassell., who was killed on the 21.10.17. 234 Alfred Cassell transferred from the 3rd Fld Engrs to the 15th FldCoy Engrs, at Ferry Post Egypt in 1916 and he was a L/Cpl. in the transport. He enlisted in Victoria in 1914 in the artillery. His parents reside in Research, Victoria. He was about 26 years of age about 5ft 8ins if height, dark curry hair a high forehead, and very quiet, weight about 12 stone. He was out in charge of a ration Limber taking rations up to a forward position and was on the return when he was killed by a shell his pony was also killed. The driver came back to camp and reported him killed. I went out and brought in his pay book and papers. handed them to the orderly room Sgt to forward to his next of kin. We brought him in and buried him in the Dickembusch Huts cemetery Church of England Chaplain read the buriel service. The cemetery is registered also his grave, but I have forgotten the number of his grave, but if you want the number I will write again. If it is any of A.Cassell's relations who are enquiring please give them my address and aske them to write to me.

I was told by Sapper Holstram on Cotober 21st. when we were at Ypres that he was with Cassall, acting as guide to the limber that Cassall was with. A shell burst over them when they were near Chatcau killing Cassall outright. He was buried either in the Belgian Chatcau Cometery or the Ypres Cometery. I am not sure which but I saw the Cross made for his grave with his name on it. I knew Cassall fairly well, he was a tall dark chap with a moustache.

I helped to carry him in from Ypres to Dickebusch and there I helped to bury him and I saw a cross put up on his grave. We made a shield to be fixed on his cross and I will be pleased to hear from his relations, who I believe, live at Bradford if they will write here to me in C. Ward, Welsh Hospt., Netley.

I know Cassall fairly well; he was a big built man, not very tell about 5' 7".

He went up with a limber to Beaumont Farm near Polygon Wood at about 10 o'clock in the morning with officers gear and I went with him. A shell fell on the Corderoy Road and killed him instantly and the horse that he was riding. The road was blocked at that time and I was standing on the bank. Owing to the heavy shelling his body had to be sleft there that day and Driver Lenny took home the limber. (he has also been killed since by a bomb from an aeroplane). Col. Clark and Cpl. Com. Wooth drivers in the 15th Fld Co. went up the next day and brought in the body, andhe was buried in the Ypres Mil.Com. and I have seen his grave and have got a photograph of it. He was about 33, dark, clean shave, very quiet disposition and j much liked.

I was told by Briver Rold that he was with Gassall onthe Yrres front on the glat Cotr. They were together in a transport, Cassall being in charge of the Limbers. They were going up to Seathook Ridge with rations, and a shell burst under his horse, killing Cassall entright. Driver Rold said that he saw Gassall buried the cass day and I myself has the cross they were going to put up over his grave. I did not know Cassall very well, and cannot describe his appearance.

He was a driver and was corporal of my section and I was told that he was killed instantly whilst carrying rations in the daytime to Anzac Ridge. He died apparently chiefly from concassion. His body was brought back by two of cur drivers the next day and was buried in the Mil. Cem at Ypres and some of our boys went to his funeral, and I saw the big cross that was to mark the whole of our companies graves. Driver Denny of the same section was with Cassall when he was killed and he has ince been also killed. Cassall joined the company in Egypt was about 5ft 9, fair complexion clean shaven, 28 years of age.

Cassall was the driver of No 3 section and was a L/Opl. He was the only man called descall in the company. I did not know his initials or his number nor did I know anything of him before the war. He was inclined to be fair, clean shaven, about 28 and about 5ft 7 or 8. I don't know if he was married. I was told by the driver who was with Cassall (I think his name was smith) that he had seen a shell fall close to their gun and kills Cassall. I am nearly sure Smith said descall had died from concuston. This occurred just before we reached Ansac Ridge and it was some time in Cotober. I think Cassall's body was required and buried.
