He was Capt. of my Company - D.,/was killed when we were attacking on the 7th June. 1917 at the village of Messines. We had get past the front German line when a shell struck and killed him outright. He was lying in the open near the Reilwey line, about 3 miles from the village, and then I returned wounded from the attack, about 3 hours after, his body was still lying there. The Germans never recovered the ground, and there would have been no difficulty for the men coming behind us after the action to have seen his body.

"Capt. Davey was killed during an advance in front of Messines on the 7th june by shell fire. He was killed instantly and was buried at Zareeba Farm about 1000 yds. in front of Messines. There is a cross over his grave. His father is a Col. in the R.A.H.C. in England and has been given all details".

A few moments after we had to move on and I lost track of him and cannot say any more about him. I think he would be buried near where he fell as I do not know of any cometery near. He was our company commender.
