Lambourne, rather slight built, fairish, clean shaven, about 22. Either at the end of May or beginning of June, Lambourne got wounded at Gallipoli, and got sent to Malta and then on to England, and in early May of this year he rejoined B. Company in Egypt. Informant last saw him in Egypt just after he rejoined. He is quite sure there is only one Lambourne in B. Company.
