

Several were killed & Alf was taken to the dressing-station wounded in legs and lower part of body. I saw him wounded & was told he died afterwards. This was on the Messines Road when we were going to take over the trench. He died the same night at the dressing-station. He belonged to the original battalion.

We were on the Messines road going up after sunset to relieve another regiment and were about a mile from the town. We were on an incline when a shell passed over No. 1 and No. E platoons and lodged amidst No. 3 woulding him seriously, others were rounded and others killed. I think 6 died outsef the eleven that were struck. That was all I saw.

"Died of wounds 25.6.17."

I saw him wounded on the slope of Messines Ridge. He was caught by shell fragments in the back and was taken to the dressing station at MULVEGLEHM near Massines, where I was told by the SyBearer he died about a half hour after his arrival. Although he was suffering intensexpain he was fully conscious till deeth I did not see his grave, but heard that he was buried at the dressing station. Refer to Fte. A. Hawke and F.W.J. Sellen A. He was hit by a shell while we were going in to hold the line at Messines on June 20rd. I saw the shell fall that wounded him. He died on the spot soon after being hit. I was about 60 yards away at the time. His body is buried at 7 10 B 9.7 (Kandahar Cemetory), which lies about half a mile 8.W. of Wilvehghen.
