

"Died of Wounds" 24-9-17.

Lane was my bosom pal, enlisted with me at Liverpool and was a Cpl in the 13th Battery (not Brigade) He was killed or rather wounded by a shell when coming out of his dug-out up Passchendaele way, living about 11 hours; was taken to a Dressing Station. I made a cross for his grave but the night I finished the cross I was wounded. I am not sure where the grave is to be found, but he was buried.

I mit Lane in France. He was dark, clean-shaved, and was about 5 %; 8 in. in height. On the 24th September, 1917, I saw him badly mounded at Tyres. He was struck by a shell. He was taken away. I did not use him after he was taken away. I heard that he died from his wounds. He was buried near Tyres. We put a Gress over his grave, and his name was on the Gress. I now this.

He was a good chap, one of the best.

"Died of Wounds 24-9-17"

In V.Brigade. Wounded by shell. hit in legs and Stomach - I was 50 yards away at time. Died on way to D/S and was buried at this D/S on right of Menin Road. I did not see him hit, he was in a little dug cut at the time. - saw shell burst. The men of the 13 h Battery went down next day and buried him - erected a cross. Known as Darkie. a big man, about 35 years of age. Think enemy now hold ground.

Was hit by a shell about 10.p.m. while carting ammunition from dumps at Dickiebush, Ypres. I saw him wounded. It was in the left side. he was conscious when I saw him taken to D/S. I think he died there.

I helped to bury him next morning at 9am. Grave right in Dickie-busch, in a small cemetary.

No other of same name in Battery.

Came from N.S.W. with original Brigade. Was on my gun. Age 23, dark, middle hight. Not certain of his no. ... Was well liked in our battery, the 15th.

"Died of Wounds 24/9/17."

Informent described Lane as about 5 feet 6 inches high, very heavy build, dork complexion aged about 30 came from Tullarmine Helbourne Informant states that Lane was in the 13th. Battery, which was close to Passehendaele in action on 24/9/17. Informant was told that Lane was coming out of his dugout with his gas mask when a piece of shell hit him. Informant saw him about an hour after he was hit. He was semi-conscious and spoke a little. Unfortunately Informant had no time to wait and investigate mero closely, but was informed that Lane died just behind the line: Informant says that so far as he was aware Lane was buried at Dickiebusch Cemetery. As Lane was his greatest pal he made a nice cross for his grave and painted it; but was wounded before he could erect it. He asked someone class to undertake the erection and believes that this was done.

"DIED OF SOUNDS 24/9/17"

"I knew LANE, we called him Darkie, he was in the 13th Battery of 5th Field Artiblery brigade with me, he was in "L" section. He was well built, dark complexion. H was wounded by a shell just off the Menin Road in September 1917. I did not see him as I was in the Yaggon Lines but I remember being told about it at the time by several mates, including Bombadier France and Gummer Brown who had seen him after he was wounded. He was taken to the Gasunlty Clearing Station at Peperinghe and Sied there so I heard. He died the day after he was wounded. He would be buried at Poperinghe."
