"Flanagan was in 19th En. Transport Section. He was going up with his wagons taking bombs to the front when a shall came and hit right under the limber of his wagon and the whole thing was blown up. He was killed instantaneously. I saw him lying dead on the side of the road. His pai Driver Frost was wounded at the same time. It was at a place called Hell Fire Corner about 2 miles behind the line on the Flanders front. The road could be seen by the Germans and was constantly shelled. I think Flanagan belonged to A. Coy. It happened in April? Constantly about 17th or 18th. I know it was before the 20th".

I knew Pte. Joseph Flanagan. He was under me in the Transport Sect. and I saw him killed instantly at Hell Fire Corner outside Tpres, about Sept. 18. 1917 in the afternoon. He was driving a limber leaded with Mills Bombs, and suddenly it blow up. He were under shell fire at the time. I recognized his body after the explosion. I helped to bury him in a Military Cometery on the right of Hell Fire Corner, and put a cross on his grove.

I have known Flanagan over 2 years. He lived at Paddington, in the suburbs of Sydnoy. He was wounded in the Dardenelles and joined us in Egypt. He was an Batta. Transport. About 6 o'clock on the evening of the 19th Sept. the Batta. vere on the may into the transhes from billets at Mickebusch. Reyond Tyres, about 8 miles along the Henin Road, several enemy shells come in. One of these along the Henin Road, several enemy shells come in. One of these fell just in front of Flanagan and the horses of the Laurius Lincber of Transh Horters, which he was driving, blowing him and them to pieces. I saw his remains. The Yellet. A. removed these for burial.

Was called "Noe" Was in the transport section and came over in 1st reinforf of 19th Battn. He was a scarting ammunition up to the line. and they were nt sure whether his ammunition blew him up or whether he was knocked by a shell. I did not see him actually hit but saw his body immediately afterwards. He was badly knocked about. I do not know where he was buried but I know they made a cross for his grave. It happened on the Ypres Menin Road on Sep. 18th.
